for support in the research, exhibition and restitution project "Confronting Colonial Pasts,
Envisioning Creative Futures" on the collections from Namibia at the Ethnological Museum in Berlin.
The project, funded by the Gerda Henkel Foundation, aims to develop more equitable and sustainable ways of collaboratively researching, curating and returning collections from colonial contexts. Artists, communities and students in Namibia are currently researching the cultural belongings returned from Berlin to Namibia, thus reactivating knowledge with and about them. The results will be documented and reflected upon in an international anthology. The WHF/WHK will support this publication process as well as the press relations for the project.

The Argelander Professorship in Critical Museum and Heritage Studies engages in transdisciplinary and transcultural heritage research, including the testing of decolonial methodologies, and seeks to plurify the formation of knowledge across museums and heritage.

The TRA 5 Present Pasts explores past and present cultural, political, social, and economic constellations in comprehensive geographic breadth and historical depth from a transdisciplinary perspective. The TRA focuses in particular on the interrelationships between contemporary challenges and processes as well as negotiations of comparable phenomena in the past. The knowledge generated from such comparative-historical research can contribute to a better understanding of the present.

The responsibilities include:

- Support in the coordination of the anthology with international partners
  - Support in project management
- Literature research
- Research in German and international archives
- Transcription of English-language interviews
- Support in editing texts
- Support with press relations for the project (incl. social media)

The requirements are:

- Academic leaning to social sciences and the arts, preferably in the fields of social and cultural anthropology, history or art history
- Excellent proficiency in English and good command of German
- Experience as a student assistant and/or in publishing are an asset
- A dedicated and flexible team player
- Ability to work in a self-organised, reliable and conceptual manner
- Transdisciplinary thinking and intercultural communication skills
